Here is the background on the applicability of the additional insurance costs for the Mt. Nebo Tank Rehabilitation Change Order:

The additional cost of \$33,396 shown in Change Order #2 is for project insurance premiums requested by the contractor, Inspec Coatings, Inc. The costs include 12 additional months insurance coverage from March 2020 to March 2021 due to the contract schedule being extended thru the end of 2020 as part of Change Order #1. The one year delay in the project schedule has been due to the telecommunication companies (AT&T, T-Mobile, and Sprint) needing time to discuss, formulate a plan to remove antennas and related equipment from the Mt. Nebo Tank, and execute the plan prior to Inspec Coatings mobilizing to the site in September 2020. The original estimated completion time for the Mt. Nebo Rehabilitation project was the end of 2019. Now, the revised schedule is for completion by the end of 2020 (12-month delay).

The insurance costs have been verified to be direct costs for Inspec Coatings to perform the project as documented by their insurance agent, Kerman Insurance Agency of Powell, OH. Inspec Coatings original contract price included one year of project insurance premiums. Environmental Partners confirmed the \$33,396 in insurance premium costs are for the liability coverages (General, Commercial, and Automobile) specified by the contract.

RE: Change Order #02: Additional Insurance Costs and Time Extension Mt. Nebo Tank Rehabilitation Project

Dear Mr. Goulet,

Environmental Partners (EP) has prepared this change order (Change Order #03) for the following items:

Inspec Coatings, Inc. has requested additional payment to maintain insurance throughout
the remainder of the project. A change order was issued for this project dated March 3, 2020
that postpones work until September 2020. The delay was needed to allow time for
telecommunication companies to formulate a plan to remove antennas and other related
equipment from the tank. This delay has caused Inpec Coatings to incur additional costs to
maintain their insurance policy through the end of the updated policy term of March 30,
2021, an additional 12-months.

A change order was prepared by EP in April 2020. However, the Board of Water Commissioners needed additional information on the breakdown of insurance costs from Inspec Coatings, Inc. Inspec Coatings, through their insurance agent, Kerman Insurance Agency, Powell, OH, confirmed to EP that there are two current insurance policies specific to the Mt. Nebo Tank Rehabilitation Project for General and Employers Liability, and Auto Liability. The annual premium of the two policies to Inspec Coatings is \$2,783 per month.

Therefore, the updated total cost to maintain insurance for an additional 12-months at \$2,783 per month is an increase in contract cost of **Thirty Three Thousand Three Hundred Ninety Six Dollars and Zero Cents (\$33,396.00).** Attached to this change order is the change order form (EJCDC C-941), and backup invoicing information from Inspec Coatings.

2. The Town of Medfield has chosen to postpone the rehabilitation work from Spring 2020 until Late Summer 2020. This change is required to provide additional time for telecommunication companies to formulate a plan to remove antennas and other related equipment from the tank. EP estimates the start of work by Inspec Coatings will begin on September 14, 2020. Therefore, the new Contract Substantial Completion Date shall be extended to November 13, 2020.
